#### Rich Reflections

Friends in Christ,

Thanksgiving Day is approaching, and pastors everywhere will write corny, predictable messages about how we should be count our blessings. They'll stress the importance of distinguishing between the things we want and the things we need. And this article will be no exception!  $\odot$ 

During the holiday season, we tend to be a little more thoughtful, a little more generous. And, this is admirable. But what if our thankful hearts prompted us to concrete action? What if being thankful propels us on a journey to do something beyond our comfort zones?

For some, the journey to thankfulness is brief. It goes something like this: "Dear God, I am so thankful that I have so many blessings (read: luxuries, privileges). I sure am thankful that I don't live in \_\_\_\_\_ (insert the name of an inner city or developing country). God, you have been very good to me! Amen."

Obviously it's good and right to thank God. But what if our journeys of thankfulness inspire in us a heart for justice? What if our thankfulness connected us to our baptismal identity?

When we are baptized, God establishes a covenant with us to "proclaim Christ through word and deed, care for others and the world God made, and work for justice and peace." We are sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. Our faith is not passive, private. But rather, our faith is proactive, public.

A powerful promise is reinforced through our baptismal: "You are the light of the world. ... Let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works, and give glory to your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:14,16). Since God has been so good to us, we are called and sent to share that goodness with others, and our church is an excellent vehicle to do so.

This holiday season, as we fill ourselves at family feasts and then struggle with the temptation of conspicuous consumerism, may we embrace the greatest blessing we have received, through our spiritual ancestors Abraham and Sarah. We are "blessed to be a blessing to all families of the earth."

What if we each committed to a cause that is bigger than ourselves? What if we walked faithfully with a nonprofit agency, ministry or volunteer organization that gave voice to a cause that is near and dear to our hearts?

The concerns are so numerous: food scarcity, mental health, elder care, homelessness, child neglect & abuse, job creation, creation care, HIV and AIDS, autism, racial justice, addictions, refugees, violence against women, peacemaking—the list is seemingly endless. But consider which one or two you are most drawn toward.

Maybe you don't feel drawn to any particular cause. If that's you, please know the Holy Spirit is an amazing guide. Through prayer, the Spirit can open your eyes, heart and mind, and direct you to a work, organization or ministry that fits with your gifts.

Everything that exists is through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. Jesus gave himself to us so we can give ourselves to others. And I acknowledge and thank Pr. Angela T. Khabeb for many of these thoughts.

"I give thanks to God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus" (1 Corinthians 1:4)

# ThankOffering Collection

Beginning in the late 19th century, Lutheran women were given small ThankOffering boxes to place in a special location in their homes as a visible reminder of blessings received. Women would add coins to those boxes almost daily as particular blessings were noted. From their use came the idea of an annual church service to celebrate their collection, and so the women of the congregation would come together for a ThankOffering service.

At that first ThankOffering in 1889, \$6,100 was collected. Today, Women of the ELCA collects more than \$1 million in ThankOfferings annually for the ministries and mission of our women's organization. ThankOfferings have always been, and still are, our opportunity to say thank you to God in both significant and ordinary moments.

At First Lutheran Church, ThankOffering Collection containers are available in the Narthex. Please pick one up and collect your loose change. Money from this collection goes to support the life-changing ministries of the Women of the ELCA. We will collect the offering during worship on November 24, or they can be dropped off at the church office.


#### **October Fusion Ministry Highlights**
