### First Lutheran Church Council Meeting Highlights: June 20, 2023 -

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Financial reports given to each council member. Moving into the summer months, the bank balance is already at a negative. Discussed how to cover bills for the coming months (see New Business).

<u>Visitors:</u> Summer Anderson and Laurie Feuchtenberger met with the council to discuss fundraising events for Fusion. Namely the need for First Lutheran to hold fundraisers that would help cover the annual \$10,000 commitment to Fusion, but also the possibility of having additional fundraisers that would be above and beyond our first commitment. Discussion was held on getting parents of the Fusion/Element students more involved with fundraising. It was the consensus of the council to only commit to fundraising towards our annual monetary commitment at this time.

### **Committee Reports:**

- Mission & Evangelism: Church without Walls on Sept 10. Discussion on where to hold the meal following the event.
- Property: shrubs/trees in the courtyard have been trimmed.

### **Old Business:**

- The council retreat at Luther Crest was very informative. Next year's retreat should be held shortly after the annual meeting and preferably held in Morris.
- Summer worship/interim update: the Synod has not sent any interim names yet. Worship leaders are lined up until mid-August that include a couple of guest pastors for communion Sundays.

### **New Business**

- General checking account is currently at a negative balance. A motion was made, seconded and carried to pull funds from the unallocated line item dedicated checking account to cover this month's shortfall.
- To help cover the general expenses through the summer months, a motion was made, seconded and carried to pull \$50,000 from the ELCA Endowment Fund.
- Benevolence: a motion was made, seconded and carried to put a hold on benevolence payments starting with May and continuing until this fall.
- Emergency pastoral coverage: some local pastors have voiced their willingness to help in the event of a funeral or hospital visit. Rita will be the main contact person that will then contact one of those pastors.
- The council accepted Laura Wiebe's resignation letter.
- Michael and Carmen Zoughbi may be here this coming fall and would need one or two host families. Announcement to be added to the newsletter/bulletins.
- Homebound list: Jo Solvie has requested the listing of homebound members so she can organize visits. A motion was made, seconded and carried approving this.
- Rita will be on summer hours until this fall, with workdays of Monday through Wednesday. In the event of an emergency, she will still be the main contact person any day of the week.

# A Note from your Church Council Treasurer

As our church goes through a time of transition, I've been thinking about what a church really is. I keep going back to a song I learned in Sunday School that says "I am the church, you are the church, we are the church together!" Now, decades after I learned it, I really think the song had the right idea. The church isn't a building, or a person, or a particular event; the church is a community of people. Whether in worship, at work, at school, or anywhere else we spend our time, we are the church.

Summer takes us in different directions. Even as we are the church in the world, ministries are continuing here at FLC in Morris. These ministries require our time, treasure, and talents to keep going. Summer has always been a challenging season financially and this year is no different. Additionally, we came into this summer in a weak financial position. Even with the reduced costs of our current pastoral situation, our giving is not keeping up with our regular expenses. On the recommendation of the Audit Committee, the Church Council approved moving \$50,000 from the church endowment fund into the general fund to sustain our ministries. We took this action so that we can keep being the church through regular ministries like worship, Sunday school, youth ministry, Bible studies, etc.

On behalf of the Church Council, I am asking you to continue to be the church in all the ways that are meaningful to you. Pray for us as we make our way through this transition and as we go out into the world. Support ministries with your time, treasure, and talents. Worship in community when you can. Prayerfully consider your giving, even when you are away from home. Simply Giving provides a great opportunity to make your giving regular, and Venmo makes it easy to give even when you are unable to join in worship.

Information on the mission projects we support is found under the Members tab on the website. Please consider working on these projects at home, donating items/supplies, or helping the Share and Care Quilters.



I leave with profound gratitude. I also want to thank everyone for their prayers, kind words, and the cards and gifts. My heart is full!

A NOTE ON STAYING AS A MEMBER OF FIRST LUTHERAN Several people have asked me if I intend to continue to be part of First Lutheran, since I plan to continue to live in Morris. Some have assumed I would continue as a "lay" member here. While I appreciate the thoughts and welcome, I believe that it is best that I not do so. Having been your pastor for six years I think it would be difficult for people not to continue to see my as "our pastor." Also, if a pastoral emergency or death in the congregation comes up, people may turn to me. Yet, I am no longer pastor here. Besides this, the ELCA strongly recommends that pastors not continue to be involved in the congregation they have served, for a variety of reasons, including that when the new pastor comes, it can create confusion. So, while I regret that this is at the case, First Lutheran won't be my house of worship in retirement. I may show up for an event once in a while though! And, you may see me around town, as I am not moving.



Everyone wants to age in place at home as long as possible. But to do so, many older adults rely on family or friend caregivers for necessary supports. Most of us are happy to provide support and are willing to step into the family caregiver role

with-out even recognizing it. While caregivers report significant emotional and spiritual rewards from the caregiving experience, they also experience physical and emotional issues as a result of the demands of their caregiving responsibilities. When family caregivers are untrained, unsupported, and do not have opportunities to engage in meaningful self-care and rest, the experience can negatively impact their physical health and mental health.

Group respite is a program designed to benefit family caregivers as well as care receivers. It benefits care receivers with the opportunity to socialize with others in a fun, friendly, and secure setting. Caregivers can join the activities or take time for themselves. First Lutheran Church of Morris has partnered with Western Prairie Human Services to bring this much needed service to Morris.

You are invited to join us on Thursday, July 13, at First Lutheran Church in the Gathering Room from 1:00-2:00pm or 4:00-5:00pm to learn more about group respite, who would be appropriate for it and volunteer opportunities to help with this.
