He is Risen

Dear Members and Friends of First,

On Saturday and Sunday, March 18-19, I had the opportunity to visit my sons in 'the cities'. It was my younger son's, Erik's, birthday that very Sunday (March 19th) and we had the rare opportunity to worship together that morning. One of my nieces, who attends the same church, joined us. I find it interesting to visit other churches; including to see how they do things. This is a large Minneapolis church which I've come to know over the years, as my younger sister's family has attended there for decades. I was reminded of the privilege it is to worship; made even more special because I could attend with my sons and niece. Afterwards, we had lunch in a nearby café, and then played games all afternoon at my niece's home.

The theme for the day was emphasized in both the children's message and the sermon. It was based on the gospel passage from Matthew 20: 20-28. This passage comes *just as* Jesus and the disciples are headed to Jerusalem, and right *after* he predicts (to them) that he will be "condemned to death" and "handed over to the Gentiles". Just after this, the mother of the sons of Zebedee, James and John, came with her two sons and knelt before Jesus, to ask a favor. "What do you want?" Jesus asks. "Declare that these two sons of mine will sit, one at your right and one at your left, in your kingdom."

This, in a way, seems absurd. Who does she think she is? Yet on the other hand, these are two of Jesus' closest associates, so maybe the mother's request seems appropriate to her. Either way, Jesus responds to James and John: "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink?" Apparently not understanding what they were agreeing to, they respond: "We are able." Jesus then informs them that their mother's request is not for him to decide but only for his Father to decide.

Then Jesus reminds them of his *and their* true calling: "the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

Our calling is also to serve, as Jesus served. We are saved from death to new life in Him. Jesus invites us to find ways to serve. This may be as simple as giving a cup of water to a thirsty person. Or, who knows. I was reminded of all this by the worship service we attended. In the days and months ahead, how might you and I serve others as Jesus did?

In the meantime, I encourage you to visit other churches when you are "out of town." It can be deeply rewarding and a great learning and growing opportunity.

Late that afternoon, as we drove back to their home, I felt good about being able to connect with not only my sons, and my niece, but on Saturday, with my sister's family and a friend. We sang happy birthday. And I was reminded of my own calling, not to be served, but to serve. For Jesus's sake.

Sunday, April 30: Offering of Letters to Congress

Bread for the World is a Christian citizens organization seeking to end hunger. Each year, Bread's Offering of Letters campaign engages churches, campuses, and other faith communities in writing personalized letters to Congress on issues related to hunger in the U.S. and around the world.

Churches and community groups collect letters and present them as an offering to God before mailing them to Congress. Hundreds of Offerings of Letters are held each year, resulting in tens of thousands of letters. Over the years, these letters and emails have helped inspire our leaders in Washington, D.C., to pass legislative victories that have impacted millions of people.

Leaders in Congress really do listen to their constituents! Every letter you write to your representatives on Capitol Hill is read and cataloged – and tells your representative which issues to prioritize.

This year, First Lutheran will be having an Offering of Letters during our Sunday, April 30th worship service. We will supply what is needed. As an act of worship, and an action to promote justice and health in our nation and the world, we will offer these letters to God and send to our legislators. This year, the Farm Bill is being deliberated, modified and will eventually be signed into law. Our letters could impact the nature and final form of the Farm Bill.

A Farm Bill That Builds Healthy, Equitable, and Sustainable Food Systems

The impact of the farm bill is significant. It not only affects the agriculture and food sectors - it can play a huge role in ending food insecurity and hunger in the U.S. and save the lives of millions abroad.

This year, Congress is working to renew farm bill programs such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and international food aid programs. Among the measures that should be included are strengthening nutrition security in domestic and international programs; creating a more equitable SNAP program; and increasing food systems sustainability.

Tell your senators and representatives to support the reauthorization of the farm bill in order to build healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.

Our group will partner with those seeking to bring hope, and we will get the opportunity to see the strengths and challenges the city of Denver is facing. Serve with local organizations caring for their neighbors in meaningful ways. We will come alongside organizations meeting the immediate needs of those experiencing homelessness as well as the ongoing needs of under-resourced people in the community. We may serve all or part of the week at a food shelf, clothing distribution center, soup kitchen, or children's program. Worship while taking in a beautiful mountain view, explore the community, and hear from local residents about what it looks like to live and serve in Denver. YouthWorks has partnered with this community since 1998.



The farm bill is our nation's most important national food system legislation. It is critical to the work of ending hunger at home and abroad. Indeed, the farm bill impacts each one of us.

As Congress works to renew our food and farm programs through the farm bill, I urge you to support legislation that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.

Specifically, I ask you to:

- Increase access to fresh fruits and vegetables by increasing support for produce-specific Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) benefits in the Gus Schumacher Nutrition Incentive Program (GusNIP). This provides resources on top of monthly SNAP benefits for the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables, primarily at farmers' markets, for a limited number of households.
- Eliminate barriers to SNAP for marginalized populations, including ending the ban on former drug offenders, eliminating work requirements for college students, and permitting indigenous communities to administer SNAP and other federal nutrition programs on reservations.
- Keep food out of landfills by increasing support for post-harvest food recovery efforts and addressing the threat to food security posed by extreme weather.
- Support funding for international food aid programs such as Food for Peace.

As a person of faith, I am moved to help and advocate for people experiencing hunger and poverty – no matter where they live. This is why I urge you to support a farm bill that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.



Quick Tips for an Effective Letter

- 1. Ask for a specific action, using your own words or this sentence:**
 - I urge you to support a farm bill that builds healthy, equitable, and sustainable food systems.
- 2. Give reasons for your request and make it personal.**
 - Share a personal reason or story that motivated you to write.
 - Show own organization's commitment: "My church is helping by (example) but I also urge you to protect the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) from cuts."
- 3. Write your name and address at the end of your letter and on the envelope, so your members of Congress know you are one of their constituents.**
- 4. For more impact, consider scheduling a meeting at your members office (or online) and personally deliver the letters with a delegation from your congregation/organization. You can contact your regional organizer for support.**
- 5. Send your letters to your member's local office or DC offices, and please don't mail them to Bread for the World. If you're mailing your letter, put each letter in a separate envelope and address it. To send a personalized email, go to bread.org/farmbill.**
