

The world-renowned Spanish Catalan cellist and conductor, Pablo Casals, mused on his life: For the past eighty years I have started each day in the same manner. It is not a mechanical routine but something essential to my daily life. I go to the piano, and I play two preludes and fugues of Bach. I cannot think of doing otherwise. It is a sort of benediction on the house... It is a rediscovery of the world of which I have the joy of being a part. It fills me with awareness of the wonder of life, with a feeling of the incredible marvel of being a human being. The music is never the same for me, never. Each day it is something new, fantastic and unbelievable.

The Psalmist must have felt a similar sense of the wonder.

"When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers, the moon and the stars that you have established; what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them? Yet, you have made them a little lower than God, and crowned them with glory and honor (Psalm 8:3-5). "For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made! Wonderful are your works; that I know full well" (Psalm 139: 13-14).

May you find time to reflect, while you sit, or stand; or go for a walk, run, or play the piano, the drums, violin, tuba, guitar or cello, or throw a ball, cook a meal, lift a weight, bale some hay, or write an essay, or paint a painting, and reflect on "the wonder of being human." Truly, you and I are fearfully and wonderfully made. All of life, and the worlds beyond us, is a miracle...

While I also love music, and Bach, like Casals, for the past 35 years, or so, I have begun each new day differently, by opening the Scripture and reading and trying to pray. I find newness each time I read, and pray, even the same passage I've read 100 times before. Always new! The Word is a "living Word"! The Psalms are my favorite book.

I know life is hard and unpredictable. It is also marvelous and a wonder. Yet, I can't help but marvel at Casals words; his awareness of the wonder of life... of simply being human. And with the psalmist, agree: "This is the day the Lord has made, let us rejoice and be glad in it." (Psalm 118: 24)

A devotion and opening prayer was given by Pastor Dan.

<u>Old Business</u>

Memorial Gift Money: discussed replacing church pew cushions; possible cost of \$4-5,000; also discussed donating money to Chris Richards and Eric Rundquist. John Dosdall also mentioned Katie Ohren. Tony told council that the Executive Council agreed to give 20% of memorial funds outside of church and keep 80% within church. - Eugene and Cathy Anderson drafted a one page article for the newspaper. Rita will submit to newspaper by Thursday.
- Next meeting will be Tuesday, September 7th at 7:00pm.
