PASTOR'S PAGE

Hello, First Family,

As we flip the calendar to November, we are fast approaching Thanksgiving, the national holiday set aside to give thanks for all of the things for which we are grateful.

Personally, I have much for which to be grateful. I have a loving and supportive family and a great group of friends. I am grateful for the faith communities of First Lutheran and Federated. And I am grateful for a loving, forgiving God.

The Bible is full of encouragements to be more thankful. The word "thank," and variations of the same are used at least 139 times in the Bible, most often with the thanks being directed at God.

The Book of Psalms is one of the biblical books most focused on being thankful. Psalm 107 is almost entirely devoted to the theme of Thanksgiving. In that psalm, the writer recounts multiple ways in which God has saved, guided, prospered and forgiven humankind. Repeatedly the psalmist commands, "Let them thank the Lord for his steadfast love, for his wonderful works to humankind." Having described the goodness that God has shown humankind, the psalm also advises, "Let those who are wise give heed to these things, and consider the steadfast love of the Lord."

We have much for which to be thankful. God has provided us with family, friends, food, clothes, shelter, jobs. When we think about all the things God has done for us, one thing should stand out above all others: God has acted in love and mercy to forgive us and give us everlasting life.

Beginning in the late 19th century, Lutheran women were given small Beginning in the late 19th century, Lutheran women were given small Thank Offering boxes to place in a special location in their homes as a visible reminder of blessings received. Women would add coins to those boxes almost daily as particular blessings were noted. From their use came the idea of an annual church service to celebrate their collection, and so the women of the congregation would come together for a ThankOffering service.

At that first ThankOffering in 1889, \$6,100 was collected. Today, Women of the ELCA collects more than \$1 million in ThankOfferings annually for the ministries and mission of our women's organization. ThankOfferings have always been, and still are, our opportunity to say thank you to God in both significant and ordinary moments.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We are one body — though we speak different languages, we are united in praising the Lord. Today, your brothers and sisters in the Holy Land are living through very critical times. But this struggle is not new. Since the days of the Apostle Paul, we have been asking for your prayers and support for the "living stones" — the faithful believers who have remained in the land where Jesus was born.

The Holy Land has never truly seen peace. Evil and division have tried to tear us apart, and life here has become increasingly difficult. Bethlehem, the birthplace of the King of Peace, has shared His message with the world — yet that peace is too often missing here at home. Perhaps God allows this tension in the Holy Land to keep it close to the heart of the world — to remind all believers to pray for peace where it began. We ask you, brothers and sisters, to raise your voices with ours. Cry out to God to bring peace to His birthplace.

The living stones of this land — the Christian families who have remained — depend heavily on your prayers, your visits, and your support. Tourism is not just economic; it is a relationship. When you come, you remind us that we are not forgotten. Without visitors, many families who work in hotels, restaurants, and souvenir shops lose their only livelihood.

Bethlehem has always been connected to Jerusalem, but today it is divided. Jerusalem — the heart — is cut off from Bethlehem — the soul. And when you divide the heart from the mind, you begin to kill the body. There are now 128 checkpoints around us. Movement is restricted. Many wait for hours at gates just to reach Jericho, Hebron, or Jerusalem with permission from the Israeli authorities if they get it. Others cannot leave their towns at all. What we are experiencing today is as severe as the hunger and suffering our ancestors faced at the end of the Ottoman Empire. We plead for your prayers — for peace, for wisdom for our leaders, and for the world to remember our shared humanity. Help us preserve our roots in this holy land.

There was a time when Christians lived in many cities and villages here. But war, poverty, and migration have scattered our people — to South America, North America, and beyond. Our numbers are dwindling. Last year, there were 50,000 Christians in the West Bank. Today, there are fewer than 38,000. And the number continues to fall.

We do not want to reach the day when there are no more Christians here. On a personal note, I had intended to come and speak to you directly this season as always— to share the voices of the families here and offer their handmade olivewood carvings, crafted in faith and hope by 40 Christian families in Bethlehem. Unfortunately, my visa was denied, and I am now unable to travel. This situation does not affect me alone — it directly impacts these families, whose carvings have already been shipped in faith, with the hope that they would be received and supported by you. Without my presence to speak on their behalf, to tell their stories, and to help with the sale of their work, these families are left vulnerable. They were already struggling, and now their financial hardship will only deepen. So I humbly ask: Please keep these families in your prayers. If you are able, your donations are deeply appreciated. And if you or your church community can help in any way to display or sell the olivewood carvings locally, that would be a powerful act of solidarity and support.

As you celebrate Christmas this year, many of your churches will sing, "O Little Town of Bethlehem." Please, when you sing it — let it be not only with your lips, but with your hearts. With our love to you and your families, Thank you for your attention, your support, and your love.

Overview of Storehouse Ministry

Storehouse ministry is a non-profit that purchases edible beans at market price and donate them to various charitable organizations who further distribute to the needy. Storehouse Ministry's mission is to help feed the needy wherever they are; be ready to spread the Gospel and build relationships among volunteers The current list of donation sites includes:

- AC HarvestCall (charity arm of the Apostolic Christian Church in Illinois)
- Orphan Grain Train (based out of Nebraska OGT ship some overseas)
- Midwest Food Bank (based out of Illinois but has centers around US)
- Second Harvest Heartland Food Bank (based out of Twin Cities)
- North Country Food Bank (based in East Grand Forks, this is the Food Bank that the Stevens County Food Shelf works with)

Storehouse ministries pack mostly 2lb bags of beans but some 25lb bags are shipped. We pack every Tuesday evening for 2 hours with volunteers from all communities in Stevens County.
